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Acknowledgments



This report marks the second statewide assessment of the epidemic of childhood and adolescent obesity in Arkansas. The Arkansas Center for Health Improvement (ACHI) recognizes that the success of such a massive statewide strategy only occurs through the dedication and hard work of many people and multiple organizations. At the forefront, once again, are the school personnel—nurses, teachers, PE instructors, principals, and superintendents—who recognize that the information obtained from the BMI screening tool is important for parents.

While most of the assessment methodology was very similar to that pioneered in the first year, ACHI did continue to improve the model. Due to the significant number of Hispanic students in public schools, individual Child Health Reports were translated into Spanish so non-English-speaking parents could receive a report in their native language. ACHI wishes to thank Dr. Eduardo Ochoa and friends, as well as Amy Scott, who provided the translation.

Additionally, ACHI has continued to refine the method so that it relies more on electronic entry of data rather than a paper entry system. Several schools in the North Little Rock School District and the Watson Chapel School District, under the leadership of Sandi Campbell and Juanita Buckmaster, volunteered to serve as pilot sites for an Internet-based system for data entry and automatic generation of Child Health Reports. These schools were able to enter student data and generate reports immediately on campus. This pilot project resulted in programming design changes that will ensure a more expeditious entry process in the 2005-2006 academic year.

Executive Summary



Childhood and adolescence is a period of growth and development. Weight problems and obesity during this time of life used to be rare, but over the past 20 years childhood and adolescent obesity has become a national epidemic. Changes in diet and lack of physical activity are the main causes of the increased prevalence of obesity in young people. Overweight youth have an increased likelihood of becoming obese adults, and adult obesity increases the risk for health problems such as heart disease, diabetes, high blood pressure, and other medical issues.

In 2004, ACHI provided the first comprehensive analysis of the state's obesity epidemic among the public school population. This report—*The 2005 Arkansas Assessment of Childhood and Adolescent Obesity*—continues to paint the picture of this epidemic in Arkansas, providing results from the second year of a statewide effort.

Act 1220 of 2003 made Arkansas the first state in the country to establish a comprehensive strategy to address the epidemic of childhood and adolescent obesity (see Appendix A). The goals of Act 1220 are to:

- change the environment within which children go to school and learn health habits every day,
- engage the community to support parents and build a system that encourages health, and
- enhance awareness of child and adolescent obesity to mobilize resources and establish support structures.

The act also requires public schools to screen all students for obesity by annually assessing their body mass indices (BMIs). Schools then report these results to parents to inform them of their children's health risks. Since the 2003–2004 academic year, ACHI has supported schools in completing these activities.

To complement these efforts and help schools and school districts understand the scope of health risks associated with obesity among their students, ACHI created individual school and school district reports on rates of child and adolescent obesity among their respective students, as well as this comprehensive statewide report.

During the 2004–2005 academic year, ACHI helped state schools complete the BMI assessment process. During this year, several improvements were made to streamline the BMI assessment and reporting processes.

- ACHI continued to support school personnel through Web-based communication and assessment tools.
- ACHI incorporated Spanish language versions of the Child Health Reports to reach the increasing number of Hispanic families in Arkansas.
- Child Health Reports, school reports, and school district reports were generated and provided to schools through both password-protected CDs and a secure access Web site.
- A Web-based technology program was piloted in 11 schools in two districts. Using a laptop computer or a PDA, school personnel measured students' heights and weights, calculated BMIs, and generated Child Health Reports on site. The pilot program was so successful that ACHI will expand the BMI Technology Project during the 2005–2006 academic year to 10 school districts that contain more than 100 schools.



Participation by schools in the second annual comprehensive statewide assessment of child and adolescent obesity among Arkansas schools was excellent. During the 2004–2005 academic year, the BMI project realized an increase in school participation to 98 percent from 93 percent the previous year. Charts and figures in this report include data from 1,111 schools in 260 of 264 school districts.

BMI assessment forms were submitted for almost 445,000 of the state's nearly 456,000 public school students. Although not all data submitted could be used because of errors or incomplete information, individual and confidential Child Health Reports were generated for parents of 371,367 students—an increase of more than 25,000 students from last year.

Child and adolescent obesity continues to be a serious problem in Arkansas. Evaluation of individual school and school district results and analyses of subpopulations most affected by the obesity epidemic reveal that no area of the state, type of school, or demographic group of children are spared the risk of this epidemic. All parents should take steps to be aware if their child is already overweight or is at risk for overweight.

Analyses of BMI assessments revealed that 38 percent of Arkansas public school students had a potential obesity problem. Specifically, 21 percent of the state's public school students met or exceeded the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's (CDC) criteria for being overweight, while 17 percent of the students were at risk for overweight. As shown in the charts presented in this report, more males (39 percent overall) than females (37 percent overall) were overweight or at risk for overweight.

Ethnic differences in susceptibility to the obesity epidemic parallel national results, but again, Arkansas data show that a larger proportion of these subgroups were affected than estimated by national sources. While 36 percent of Caucasian youth were in a high-risk category, 41 percent of African–American youth and 47 percent of Hispanic youth were in a high-risk category. Examination of gender differences within ethnic groups revealed even more alarming results: more than half (51 percent) of Hispanic males were classified as overweight or at risk for overweight and 44 percent of African–American females were overweight or at risk for overweight.

As students started kindergarten and elementary school, approximately one-third of them were either overweight (17 percent) or at risk for overweight (18 percent). The obesity epidemic slowly increased until the middle school years—5th–7th grades—where 42 percent of children were in one of the two high-risk categories (24 percent overweight, 18 percent at risk for overweight in the 6th grade). Through the high school years, the proportion of adolescents in one of the two high-risk categories decreased, largely due to the reduction in the numbers of females in the heaviest risk group. However, 36 percent of graduating males and 33 percent of graduating females remained in one of the two high-risk groups.

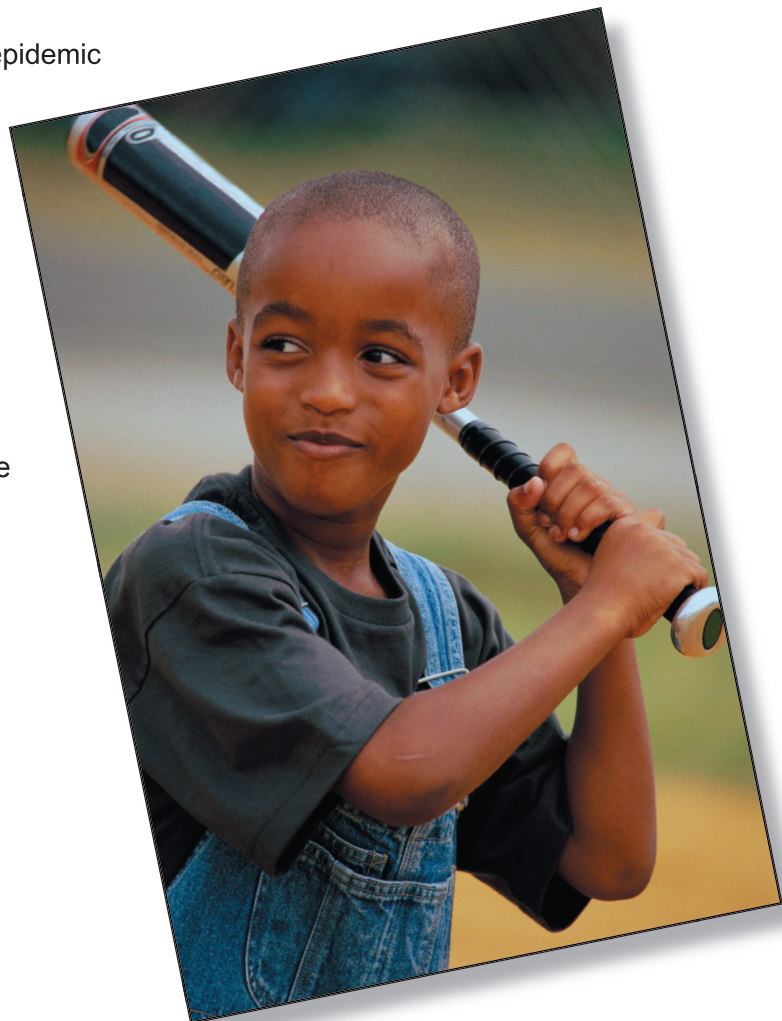
Although variations were noted across the state and all schools should take steps to combat the epidemic, some schools and their communities should take immediate action. When evaluating the percentage of students who were in the two highest risk categories (overweight or at risk for overweight), ranges of 20–30 percent to more than 50 percent were found among some school districts. More than one-third (43 percent) of the school districts had more than 40 percent of their students in the overweight or at risk for overweight categories.



These findings represent a major risk for the children in Arkansas. The children and adolescents who are overweight or at risk for overweight are in every school, district, and region; are both urban and rural; and include all ethnic groups and both genders. Most importantly, this information provides an educational opportunity for our schools and communities by highlighting a critical situation so that families can take steps to reduce their children's risk for overweight, thereby preventing diabetes, heart disease, and high blood pressure that these students will predictably develop.

Through broad-based collaborations at the local and state levels, including the health and education communities, parents now have new and critically important health information about their children. With school and school district reports, school boards and the School Nutrition and Physical Activity Advisory Committees have real information to deliberate on and to use to inform local school policy decisions, and state and national leaders have a better portrait of the obesity epidemic. Targeted interventions can be developed and deployed to provide needed support to families with children at risk.

Obesity has steadily increased to the epidemic proportions seen across the state and the country today. As expected, the overall percentage of students in high-risk categories did not change dramatically in only one year. The causes of obesity are complex. Homes, schools, communities, government, and the media have roles to play in finding long-term solutions to the obesity problems faced by our youth. We must all work together to help all Arkansans eliminate risks to the state's children and help them become healthy and productive adults.



Introduction



With the passage of Act 1220 in 2003, Arkansas established a strategy to address the epidemic of child and adolescent obesity. The goals of Act 1220 were intended to 1) change the environment within which students go to school and learn health habits every day, 2) engage the community to support parents and build a system that encourages health, and 3) enhance awareness of child and adolescent obesity to mobilize resources and establish support structures.

The goal of this report is to highlight not only the results of BMI assessments of Arkansas school students in 2004–2005 but to also show that simple changes are making major differences in the lives of students and in their school and community environments. To address the goals of Act 1220, schools created the Nutrition and Physical Activity Committees to include school personnel, community members, and stakeholders.

This year, ACHI recognized the need to streamline the assessment and reporting process. The staff at ACHI developed a process to get assessment forms in the hands of school personnel earlier in the academic year, piloted a Web-based program to more quickly enter assessment information and print reports to parents, and created a Spanish version of Child Health Reports for Hispanic and Latino parents. ACHI will continue to listen to those responsible for implementing the assessment and reporting process and use every innovation at its disposal to provide them with the needed tools and technology.



BMI Data Collection Efforts



Process

During the second year of Act 1220, ACHI worked with school and educational cooperative staff to implement processes that would begin to help schools streamline the BMI assessment process and take on more responsibility for implementation, as outlined in the legislative mandate. ACHI also began looking at ways in which technology could be used to measure students' heights and weights, calculate BMIs, and generate reports to parents. The processes used were as follows.

- Assessment packets, including forms, were developed and sent to all school districts and placed on the ACHI Web site.
- Community health nurses at the education service cooperatives conducted training for new school staff.
- Student bar-coded labels were developed and sent to all school districts.
- ACHI entered into a contract with the University of Arkansas at Fayetteville's Survey and Research Center to enter all data collected from the schools, and with a private firm, Costech, to develop a Web-based entry system for collecting data, calculating BMIs, and generating reports.
- Student data were collected by school nurses, health educators, and other personnel.
- A pilot study was conducted in the North Little Rock and Watson Chapel School Districts using a Web-based data entry system. Computers, laptops, and pocket PCs were used in the process.
- School's individual Child Health Reports were generated and made accessible via the Web by using the passwords that were sent to the superintendent of each school district.
- Reports were generated for each participating school and school district and are accessible via ACHI's web site.

Definition of Body Mass Index

The BMI is a ratio of weight and height, and is a better assessment of obesity than weight alone. Using an accurate weight and height, BMI is calculated using the following formula:

$$\text{BMI} = \frac{\text{Weight in pounds}}{(\text{Height in inches})^2} \times 703$$

Boys and girls grow and develop at different rates. Based upon the CDC recommendations, BMI percentile for children is calculated individually for each boy and girl based upon his or her gender, age, height, and weight. BMI percentiles are then used to categorize children according to whether they are underweight, healthy weight, at risk for overweight, or overweight. A higher BMI indicates greater risk for having or developing obesity-related health problems.



Health care professionals group BMI percentiles to identify underweight and overweight children as follows.

- **Overweight:** BMI-for-age greater than or equal to 95th percentile
- **At risk for overweight:** BMI-for-age between 85th and less than 95th percentiles
- **Healthy weight:** BMI-for-age between 5th and less than 85th percentiles
- **Underweight:** BMI-for-age less than 5th percentile

A BMI assessment is a screening tool only. An individual child's BMI should not be considered a final indicator of whether or not a child has a weight problem that requires attention. Further evaluation by a health professional is the recommended next step for a child who is classified as at risk for overweight or overweight.

Aggregate child BMI assessments are, however, an excellent indication of the extent of the current problem of child and adolescent obesity in schools, school districts, and the state. The data presented in this report serve as a warning about the potential future health problems that Arkansans may face as these children become adults.

Student and School Participation in the BMI Initiative

This year, 98 percent (1,111) of Arkansas public schools participated in the statewide BMI assessments, an increase from the 93 percent participation rate last academic year (see Appendix B). Data from 1,111 schools in 260 of 264 school districts were included in this report. For validity purposes, schools that provided data on fewer than 20 percent of their students were not included in this report.

BMI assessment forms were submitted for almost 445,000 of the state's nearly 456,000 public school students. Although not all data submitted could be used because of errors or incomplete information, individual and confidential Child Health Reports were generated for parents of 371,367 students—an increase of more than 25,000 students from last year.

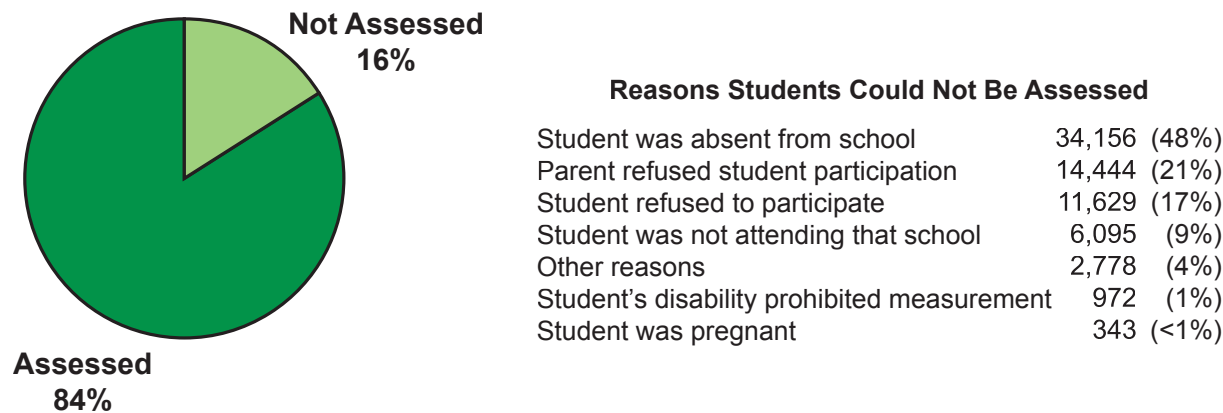
Data Collected and Reasons Children/Adolescents Could Not Be Assessed

Data collected included the address, grade, gender, ethnicity, and birth date of the student, along with his/her height and weight. On all data collection forms, check boxes could be used to indicate if a student could not be assessed and space was allotted for the reason why.

Among the students for whom data forms were prepared, less than 16 percent (~70,000) of the students could not be included in the assessment. There are multiple reasons for these exclusions, ranging from a student's absence from school on the date of the assessment to incorrect data entry by those conducting the assessments.



There was little difference between the number of males and females who could not be assessed, but there were slight variations by ethnic groups. Of the non-assessed students, 72 percent were Caucasian, 19 percent were African American, six percent were Hispanic, and one percent were Asian. The biggest differences occurred by grade: approximately 25 percent of high school, 14 percent of middle school, and 11 percent of elementary school students could not be assessed for BMI. Reasons why students could not be assessed are noted below.



Special Circumstances for Reporting

ACHI reported statewide BMI percentages of underweight, healthy weight, at risk for overweight, and overweight students for selected demographic subgroups. Percentages for these four classifications were also reported for the majority of districts and counties in the state. However, to protect private health information (based on rules in the federal Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996) and in compliance with common statistical reporting practices, if less than five students were in a particular classification, then that group was either not reported or was combined with another group. This occurred in a few school districts and counties that had students in the underweight category. The group was combined with the healthy weight classification group.

When reporting results at the school level, a small number of schools had less than five students in the overweight or at risk for overweight classifications. When this occurred, the two groups were combined.

Due to the large number of students assessed, results by gender, ethnic groups, and grade were included in this report that are not available from any other source in the nation. Gender and grade were available for virtually every student in the system. Information on ethnicity was missing for one percent of the students assessed.



Child Health Reports

There were five types of Child Health Reports generated and sent to parents (Appendix C). Each student's parents received one of the following reports, depending upon the child's information.

- Underweight
- Healthy weight
- At risk for overweight
- Overweight
- Unable to have BMI calculated

Each confidential report was specific to a student and was sent to the student's parent or guardian. In addition, these reports were translated into Spanish for those students whose records indicated English as a second language.

The reports explained the importance of collecting BMI information; provided a definition of BMI; and listed the student's height, weight, and BMI. Parents were advised to consult with their family doctor if they had questions or concerns, and were provided with the American Academy of Pediatrics' suggestions for ensuring healthy lifestyles among children and adolescents, such as offering healthy snacks, drinking fewer sodas and more water, limiting television, and increasing family activities.

In addition to the information sent to parents, doctors and nurses across the state have access, via www.achi.net, to specific instructions about how to confirm whether or not a child has a weight problem and specific steps to identify early indicators of obesity-related diseases (Appendix A).

School Reports

Each reporting school received a specific school-level profile of its students and the extent to which it is being affected by the obesity epidemic. BMI was defined, and the formula used and child classifications based on BMI percentile rankings were explained. BMI classifications for the school were presented for male and female students by grade and collectively for all students. This information was presented as both a table and a graph. (School reports are available at www.achi.net.)

Results for BMI classifications of students in individual schools in Arkansas are presented in Appendix E.





School District Reports

School district reports were generated with the combined information of all available school data in that district. Summary statistics for each school within the district and overall results for the district provide a community assessment of the environmental impact of obesity on public school students. Additional information, similar to the school report, was depicted using both tables and charts. (School district reports are available at www.achi.net.)

Results for BMI classifications of students in individual school districts in Arkansas are presented in Appendix D.

Statewide Report

In this statewide report, results are presented for all students with a valid BMI and separately for males and females. Results are also presented for the largest three ethnic groups in Arkansas: African American, Caucasian, and Hispanic. Additionally, BMI classifications are reported by gender and ethnic group; by grade; by gender and grade; and by gender, ethnic group, and grade. Overall BMI classifications for students by county are shown in Appendix F.

Crossett Student Wins Essay Writing Contest

Wendy Gibson, a Norman Jr. High student, won first place in the 7th to 9th grade category for her submission to the 2005 Arkansas Action for Healthy Kids Essay Contest. In her essay, Wendy revealed that “I did not know the difference between a ‘BMI’ and a ‘BMW.’” After talking with her parents about the Child Health Report they received last year, Wendy decided to make changes in her diet and level of activity. Among the changes Wendy incorporated into her new lifestyle were replacing “soda drinks with water” and choosing “low-fat milk with my lunch tray at school.” She also started walking and riding a bike. “Some afternoons Dad joins me. I love spending time with my dad and getting exercise too.”



Governor Mike Huckabee presented Wendy and the other winners in the 2005 Arkansas Action for Healthy Kids Essay Contest with certificates and posed for photos with the students and their parents.

Statewide Results



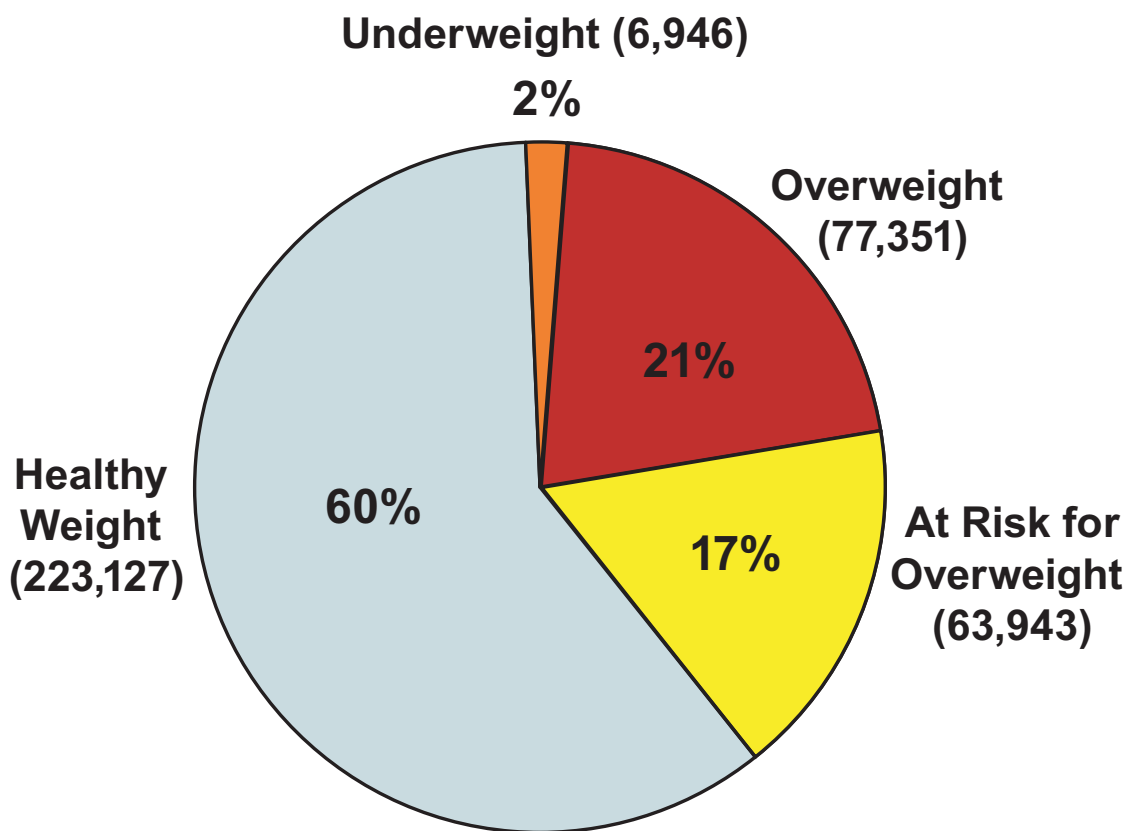
Overall Statewide Results

Statewide results presented in this section of the report are based on the data from 371,367 individual students, 1,111 schools, and 260 school districts.

BMI Classifications for All Students

Among the public school students assessed in Arkansas, 21 percent met or exceeded the CDC's criteria for being overweight and 17 percent were at risk for overweight. Consequently, the BMI screening identified 38 percent of Arkansas children as having a potential obesity problem. Less than two percent of children were identified as being potentially underweight.

FIGURE 1. BMI CLASSIFICATIONS FOR ALL STUDENTS

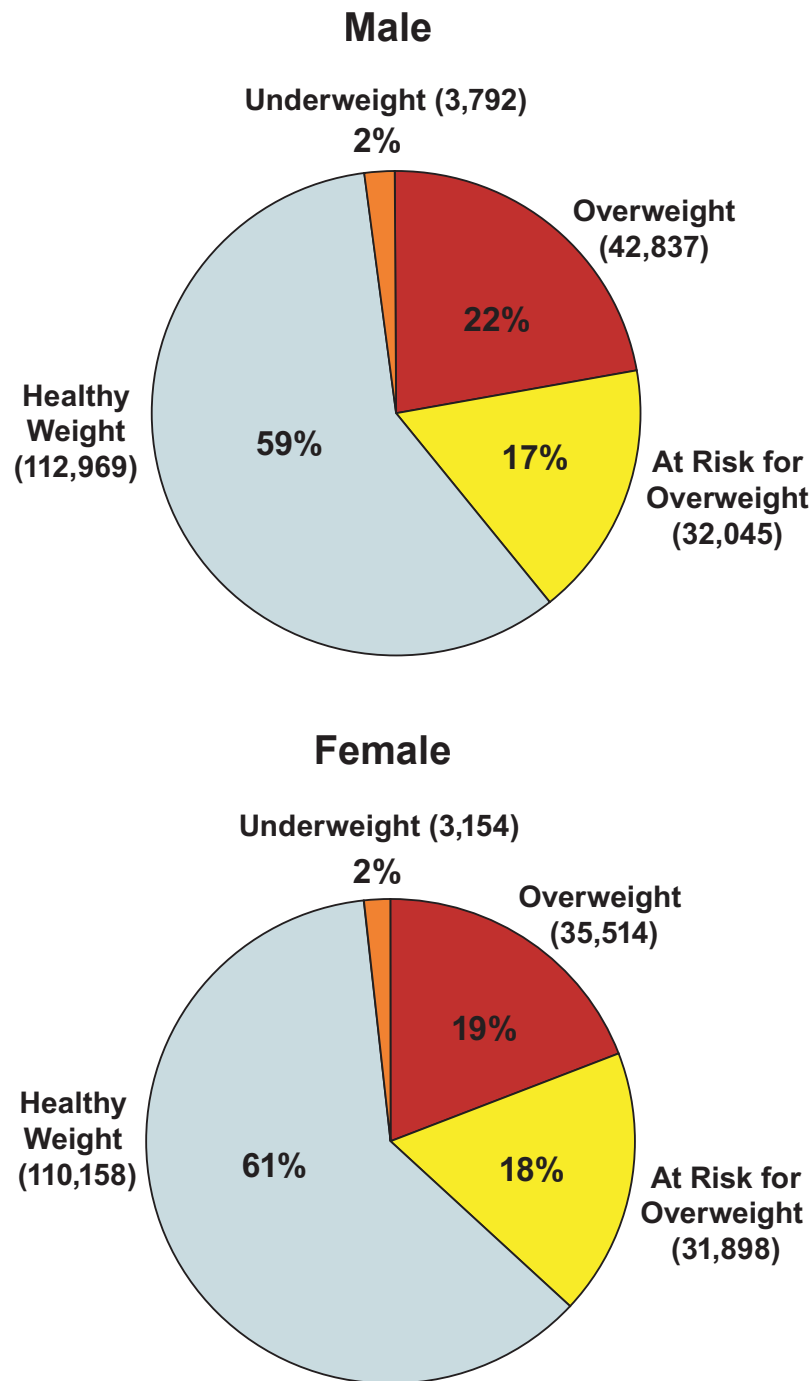




BMI Classifications by Gender

More males (39 percent overall) than females (37 percent overall) were overweight or at risk for overweight. Among those identified as overweight, the percentage for males (22 percent) was slightly higher than the percentage for females (19 percent). The percentage underweight was the same regardless of gender.

BMI Classifications by Ethnic Group

Hispanic students were more likely to be overweight or at risk for overweight compared with Caucasians or African Americans—47 percent of Hispanic students were classified as either overweight or at risk for overweight. Among African-American students 41 percent were in the two highest risk categories, while 36 percent of Caucasian students fell in this range. Caucasians had the highest percentage of students classified as underweight at two percent.

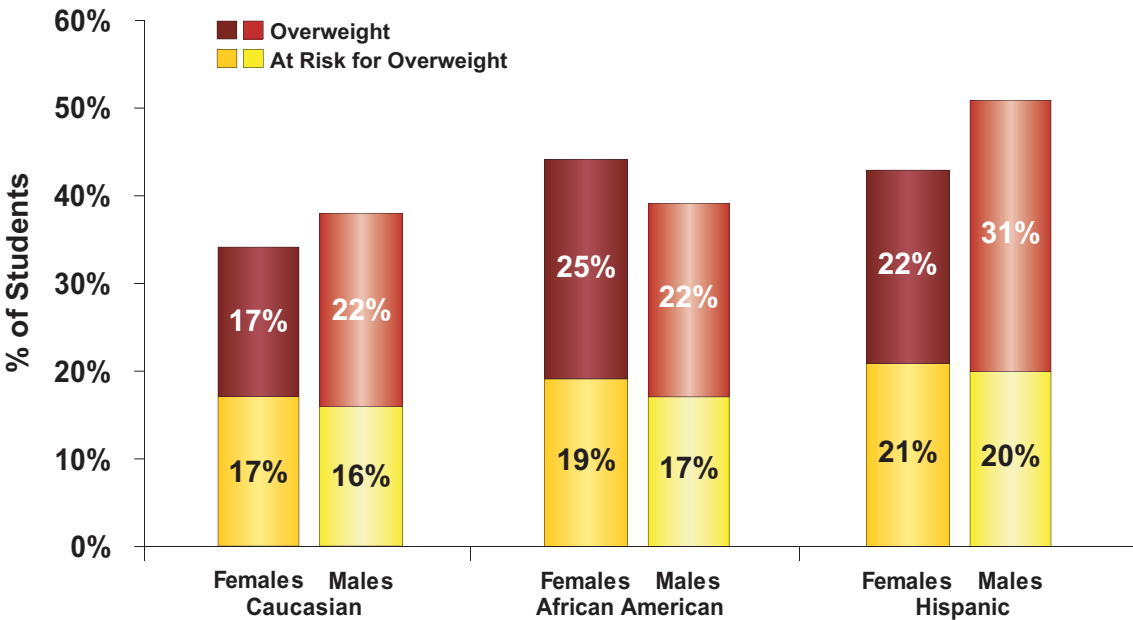

BMI Classifications by Gender and Ethnic Group

Hispanic males and African-American females had the highest obesity risks when evaluating results by race and gender. More than half (51 percent) of Hispanic males were classified as overweight or at risk for overweight and 44 percent of African-American females were overweight or at risk for overweight. There was virtually no difference between Caucasian and African-American males, and Hispanic females were similar to African-American females.

FIGURE 3. BMI CLASSIFICATIONS BY GENDER AND ETHNIC GROUP

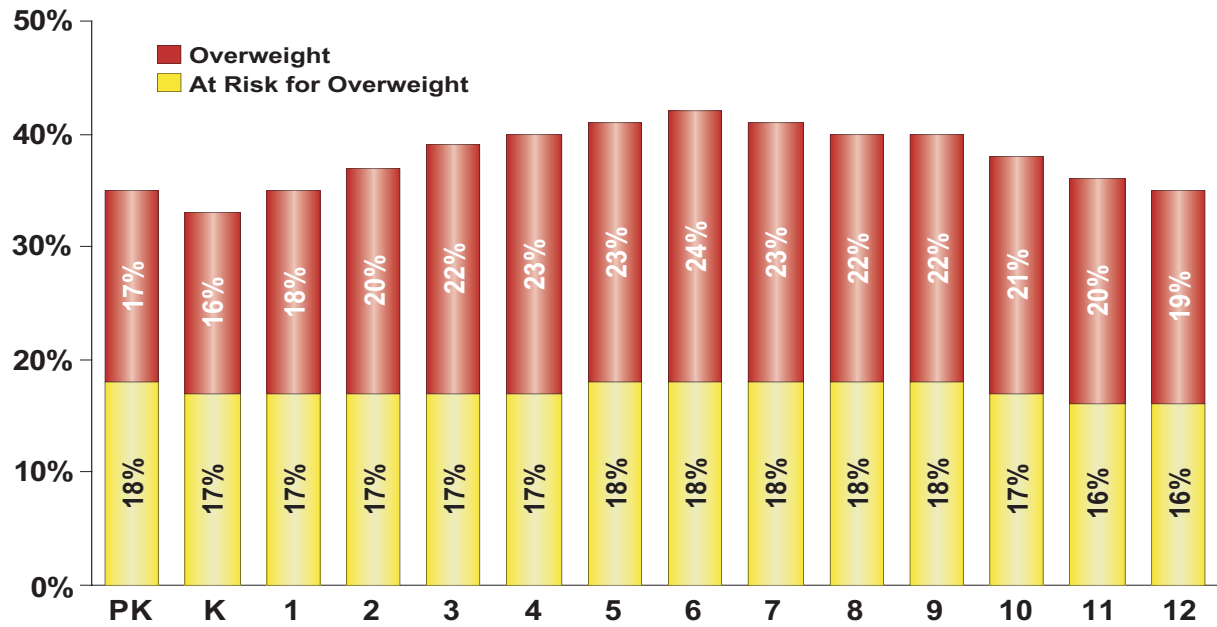




BMI Classifications by Grade

The percentage of students who were overweight or at risk for overweight increased during the elementary school years and peaked during middle schools years. More than 40 percent of the students in grades 5–8 were classified as overweight or at risk for overweight.

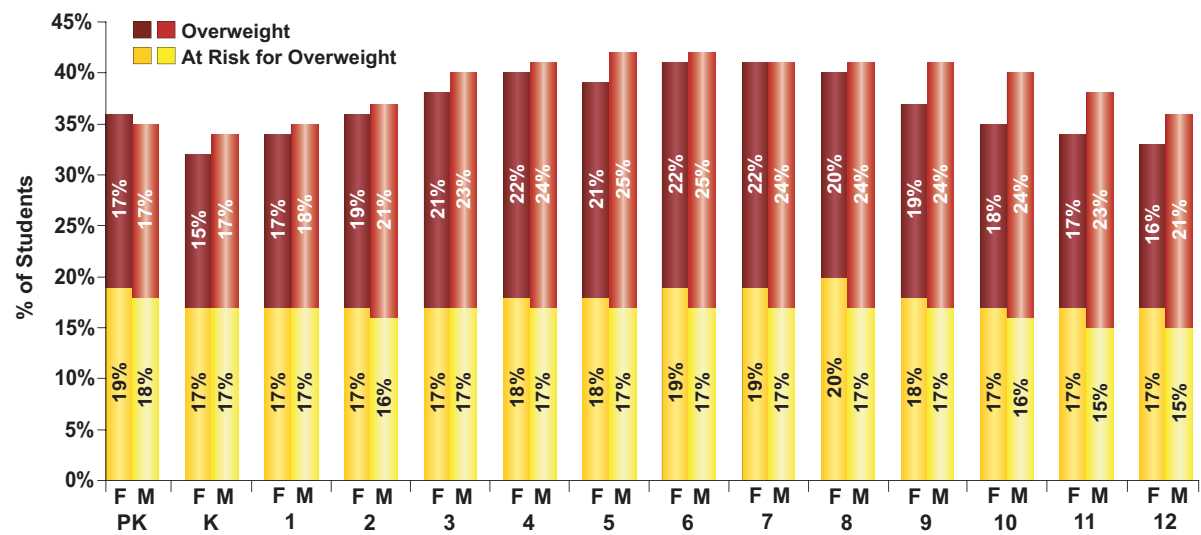
FIGURE 4. BMI CLASSIFICATIONS BY GRADE



BMI Classifications by Gender and Grade

Across most grades, males were classified as overweight or at risk for overweight more frequently than females. In middle school, the variance between male and female students identified as overweight or at risk for overweight is small; however, in high school, this difference becomes more apparent.

FIGURE 5. BMI CLASSIFICATIONS BY GENDER AND GRADE

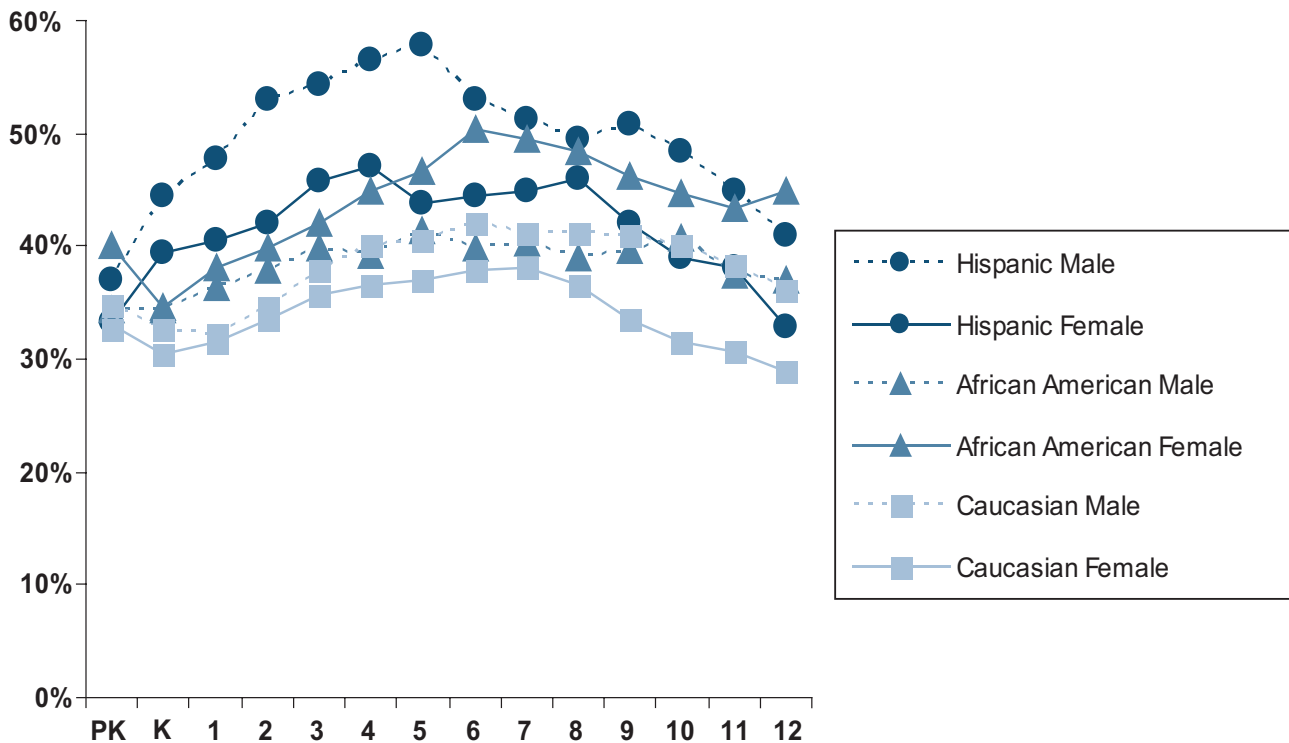




BMI Classifications by Gender, Ethnic Group, and Grade

Hispanic males and African-American females had the highest obesity risks during the middle school years. Almost 60 percent of Hispanic males were classified as overweight or at risk for overweight during the middle academic years, while almost half of African-American females were overweight or at risk for overweight during middle academic years. Fewer Caucasian females were classified as overweight or at risk for overweight during the high school years, compared with other gender and subgroups.

School District Results

The following maps portray the percentage of children with a valid BMI assessment who were classified in either of the two high-risk groups (overweight or at risk for overweight) by Arkansas school district. The districts used in this report reflect consolidation for the 2004–2005 academic year. Districts where no data were received by the data submission deadline (June 1, 2005) were not shaded. The maps were shaded according to the magnitude of the percentage. The percentages were calculated based on the set of school children in a district with a BMI and are not an average of each school in the district. The lightest shade represents the districts with the lowest percentage (less than 30 percent) of students classified as overweight or at risk for overweight and the darkest shade indicates those districts with the highest percentage (greater than 50 percent) of students in the two high-risk categories.

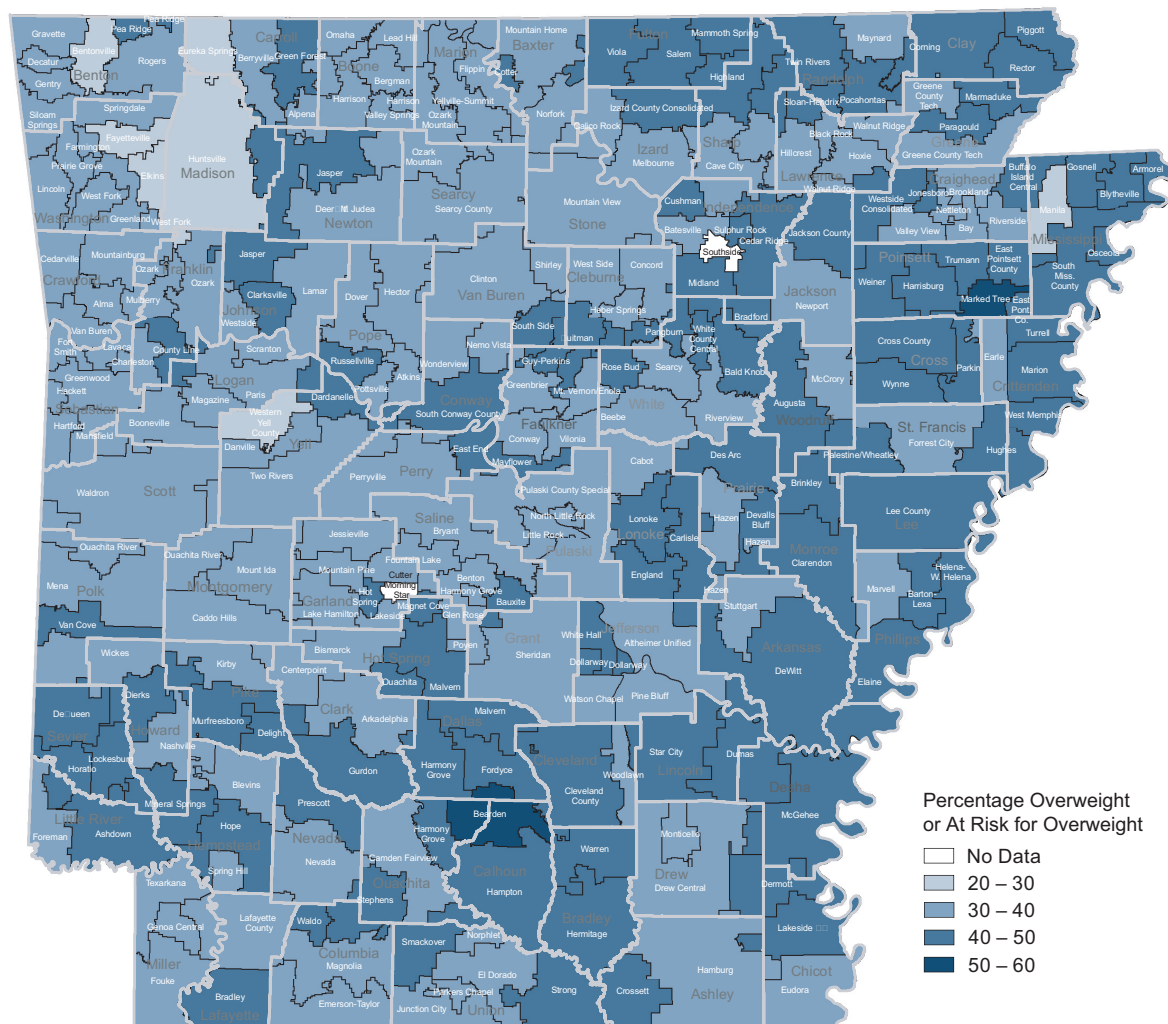




Overweight or At Risk for Overweight Children/Adolescents

When evaluating the percentages of students who were overweight or at risk for overweight, eight school districts were in the lowest category with rates of 20–30 percent; 139 of the school districts had rates of 30–40 percent, 109 school districts had rates of 40–50 percent and three school districts had more than 50 percent of their students in the overweight or at risk for overweight categories.

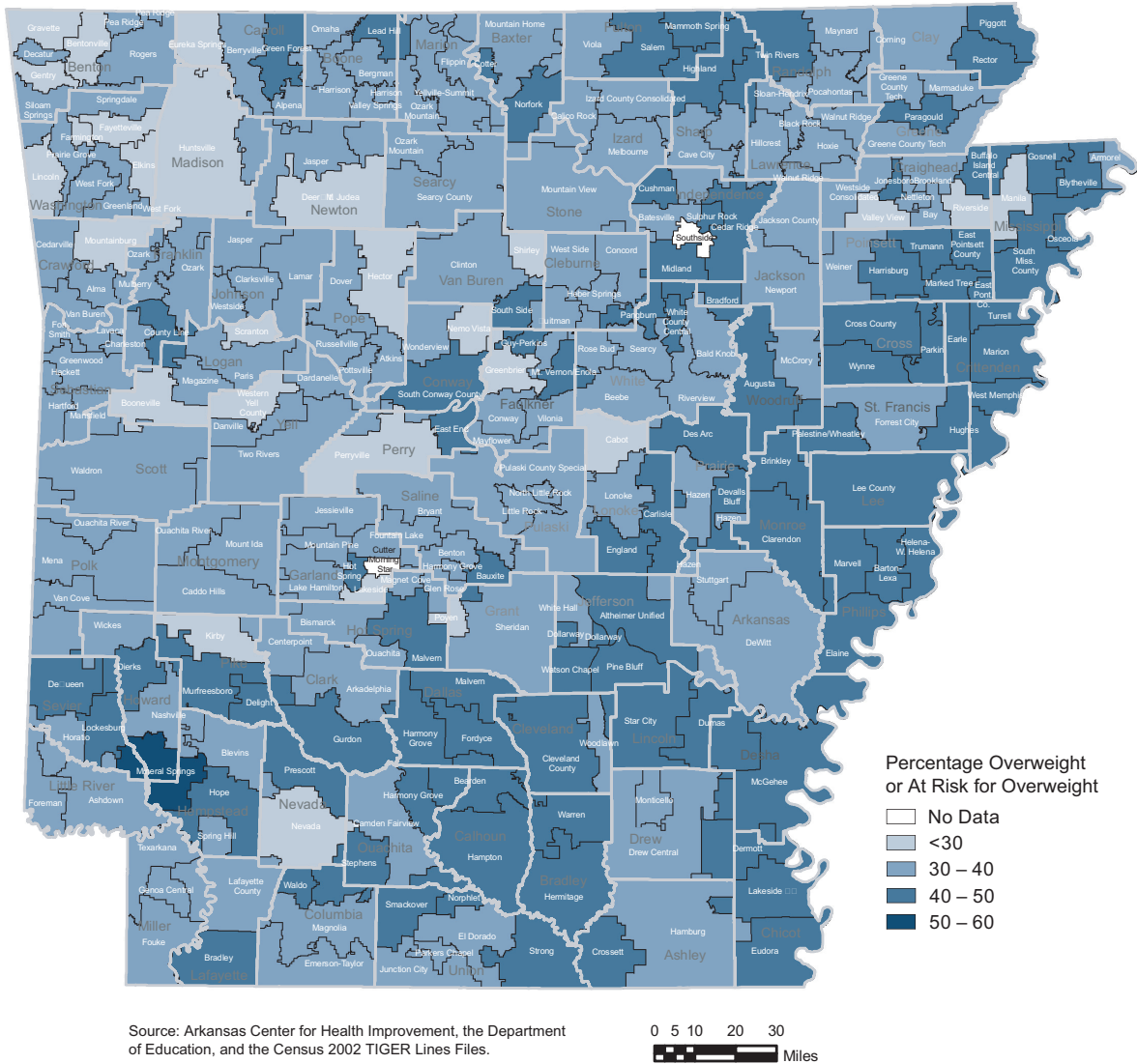

Overweight or At Risk for Overweight Children/Adolescents by Gender

When evaluating the percentages of students who were overweight or at risk for overweight, 28 school districts were in the lowest category with rates of 20–30 percent; 138 of the school districts had rates of 30–40 percent, 91 school districts had rates of 40–50 percent and two school districts had more than 50 percent of their students in the overweight or at risk for overweight categories.

FIGURE 8. OVERWEIGHT OR AT RISK FOR OVERWEIGHT CHILDREN/ADOLESCENTS—FEMALES



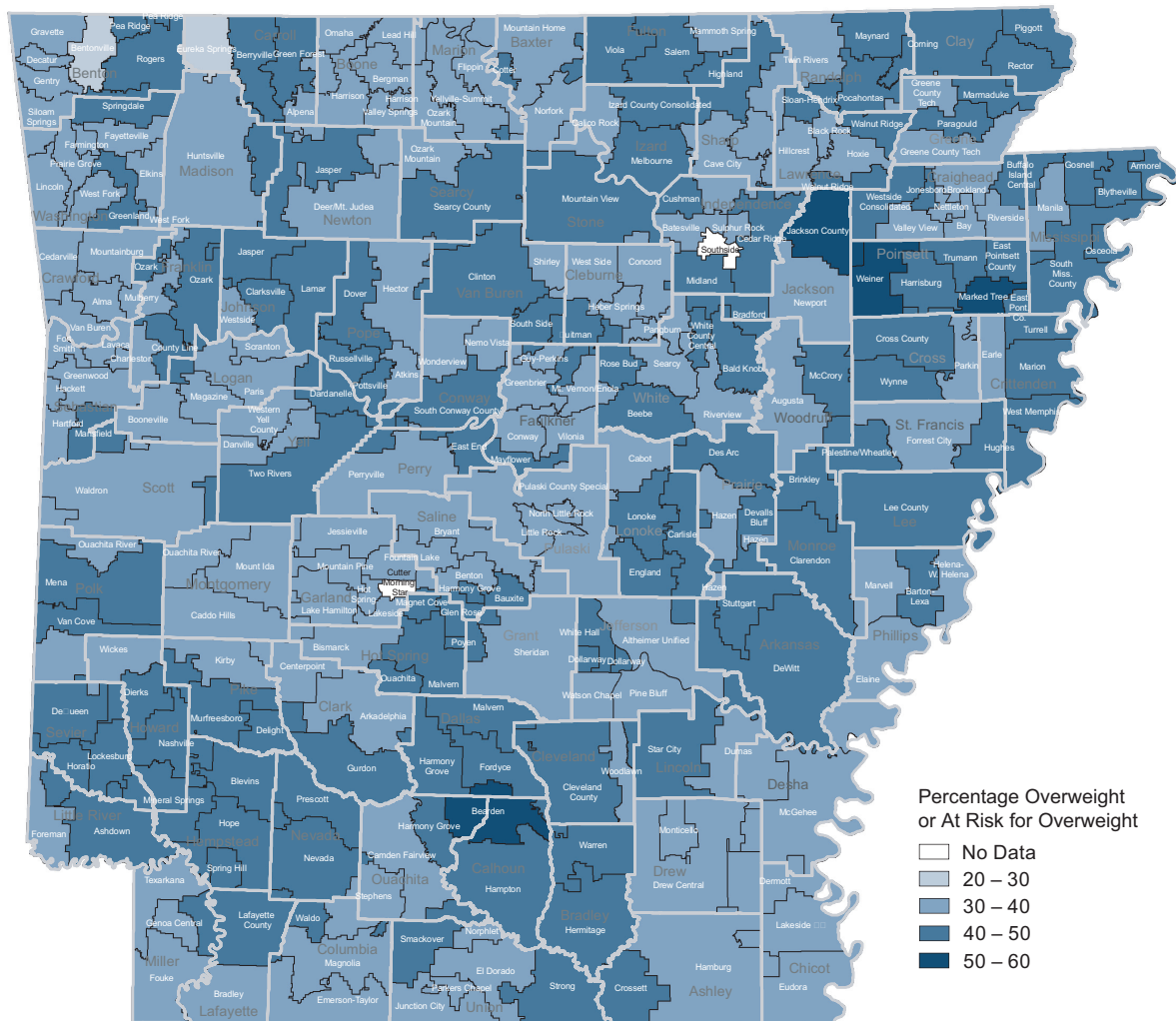

Overweight or At Risk for Overweight Children/Adolescents by Gender

When evaluating the percentages of students who were overweight or at risk for overweight, three school districts were in the lowest category with rates of 20–30 percent; 132 of the school districts had rates of 30–40 percent, 120 school districts had rates of 40–50 percent and four school districts had more than 50 percent of their students in the overweight or at risk for overweight categories.

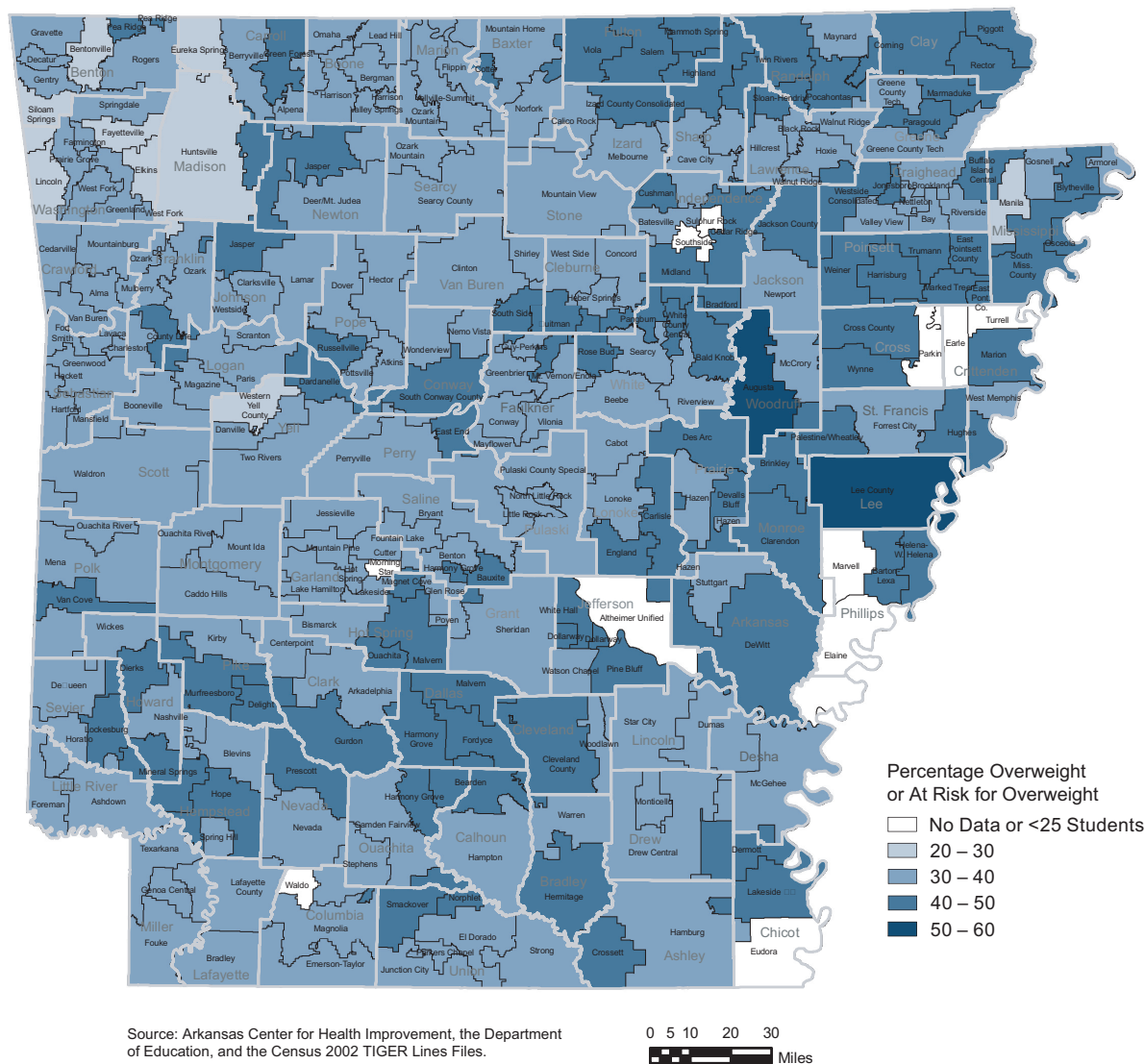


Overweight or At Risk for Overweight Children/Adolescents by Ethnic Group

Before mapping the percentage of students who were overweight or at risk for overweight for the three most prevalent ethnic groups, the data were restricted to include only those school districts with at least 25 students in these two BMI categories. This was done because small population sizes tend to overstate or under-represent the true percentages. Consequently, one can assume in most cases that at least 50 families of an ethnic group had children attending school in the shaded districts.

When evaluating the percentages of students who were overweight or at risk for overweight, 10 school districts were in the lowest category with rates of 20–30 percent; 148 of the school districts had rates of 30–40 percent, 85 school districts had rates of 40–50 percent and two school districts had more than 50 percent of their students in the overweight or at risk for overweight categories.

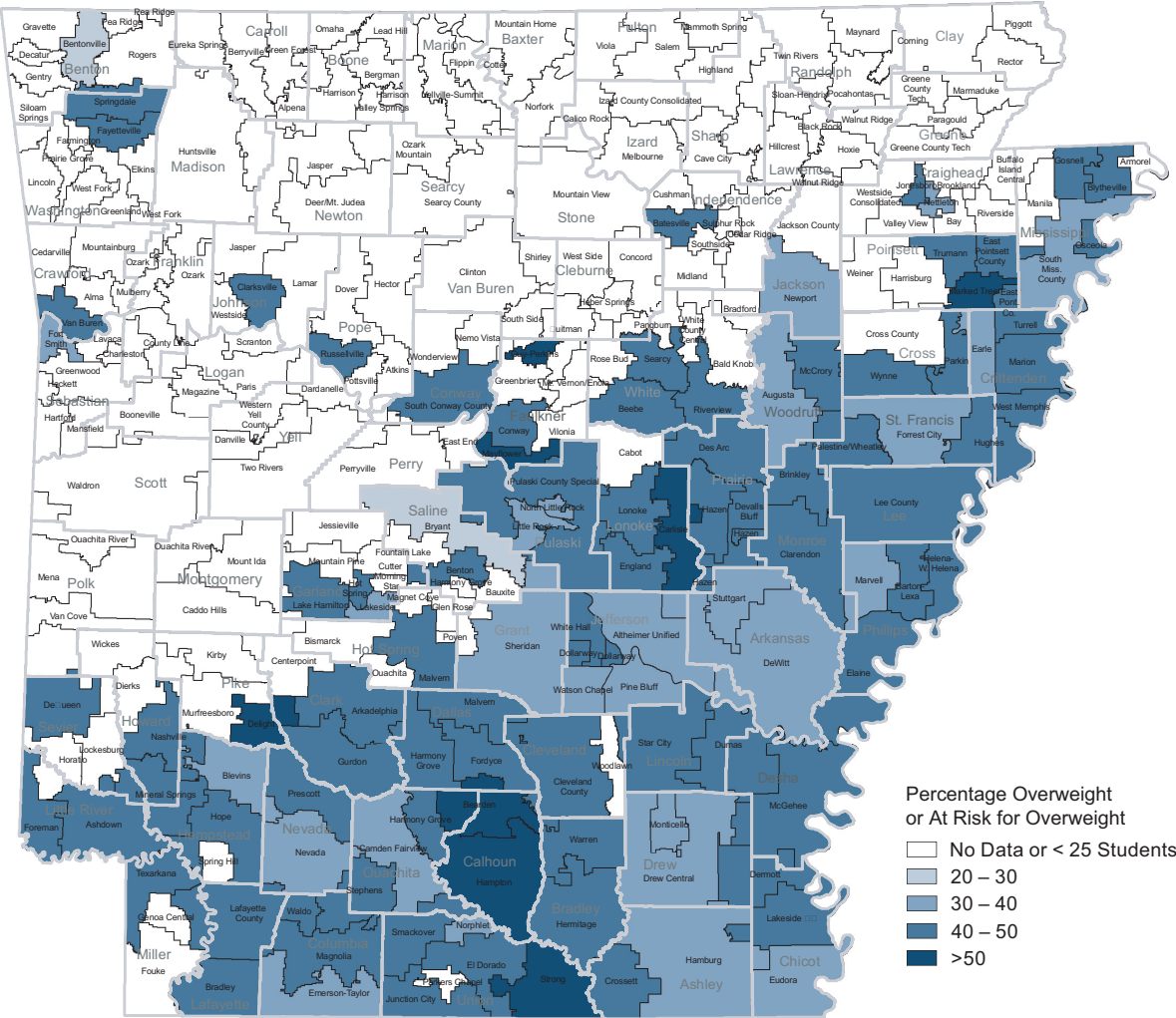

Overweight or At Risk for Overweight Children/Adolescents by Ethnic Group

When evaluating the percentages of students who were overweight or at risk for overweight, two school districts were in the lowest category with rates of 20–30 percent; 28 of the school districts had rates of 30–40 percent, 74 school districts had rates of 40–50 percent and nine school districts had more than 50 percent of their students in the overweight or at risk for overweight categories.

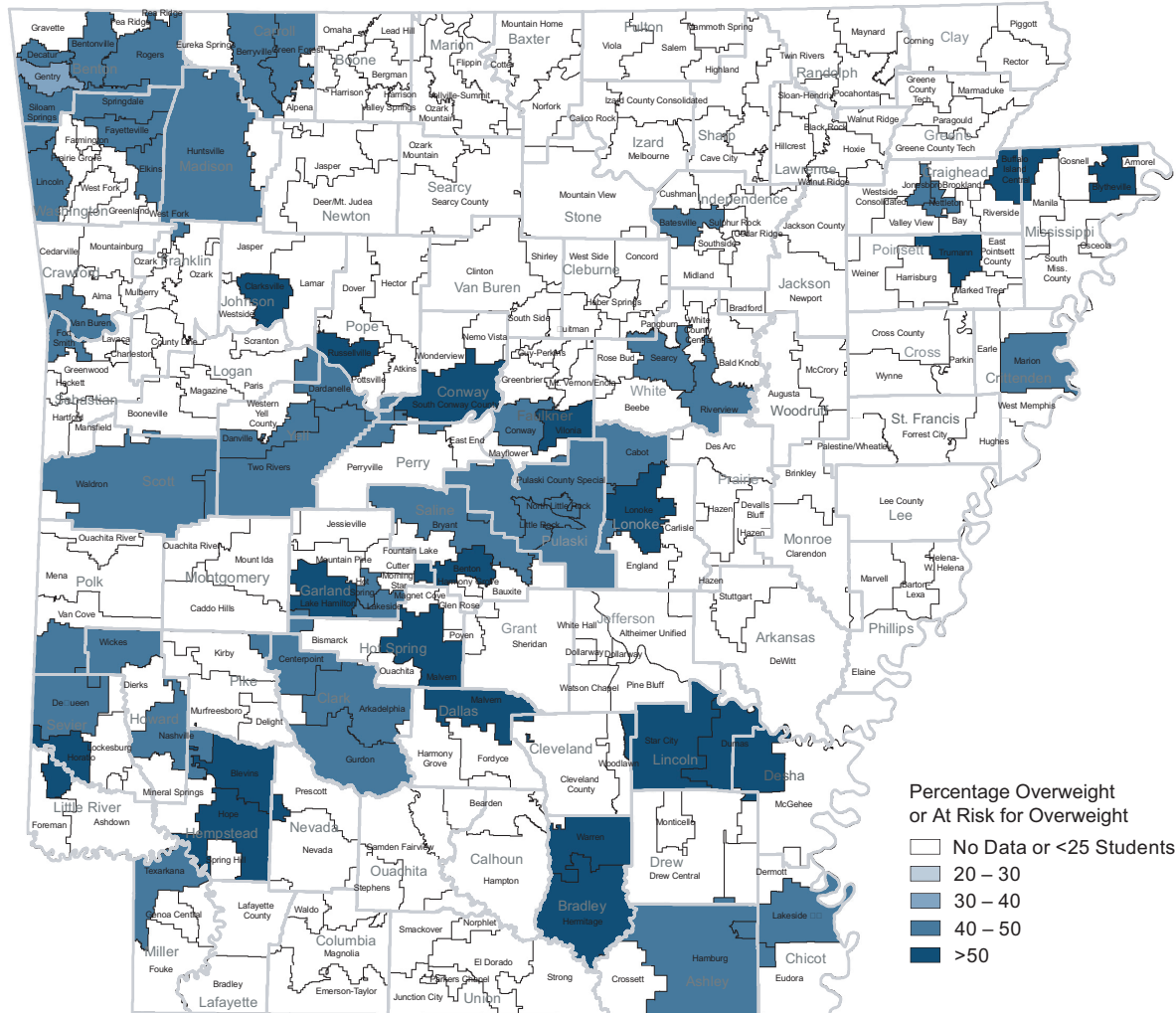

When evaluating the percentages of students who were overweight or at risk for overweight, no school districts were in the lowest category with rates of 20–30 percent; one school district had a rate of 30–40 percent, 40 school districts had rates of 40–50 percent and 18 school districts had more than 50 percent of their students in the overweight or at risk for overweight categories.

The following maps portray, by Arkansas county, the percentage of students who had a valid BMI assessment and who were overweight or at risk for overweight, and estimates of the number of students classified in these two categories. In Arkansas, the majority of students attend schools within the county in which they live. Therefore, county percentages were based upon the county in which the students attended school. These percentages were calculated based on the set of students residing in a county who had a valid BMI.

Figure 13 was shaded according to the magnitude of the percentage of students who were overweight or at risk for overweight. Results were reported for a county if at least 20 percent of its students had a valid BMI. The lightest shade represents the counties with the lowest percentage overweight or at risk for overweight (30–35 percent) and the darkest shade indicates those with the highest BMI percentages (45–50 percent).

Figure 14 is shaded according to the magnitude of the estimated number of students in the county who were overweight or at risk for overweight. To estimate the number of students, the percentage overweight or at risk for overweight was multiplied by the 2000 US Census Bureau estimates of the number of children aged 4–19 residing in the county. Consequently, these numbers include estimates for students in private and home schools. The lightest shade represents the counties with the lowest number of students overweight or at risk for overweight (less than 1,000) and the darkest shade indicates those with the highest number of students (more than 3,000).

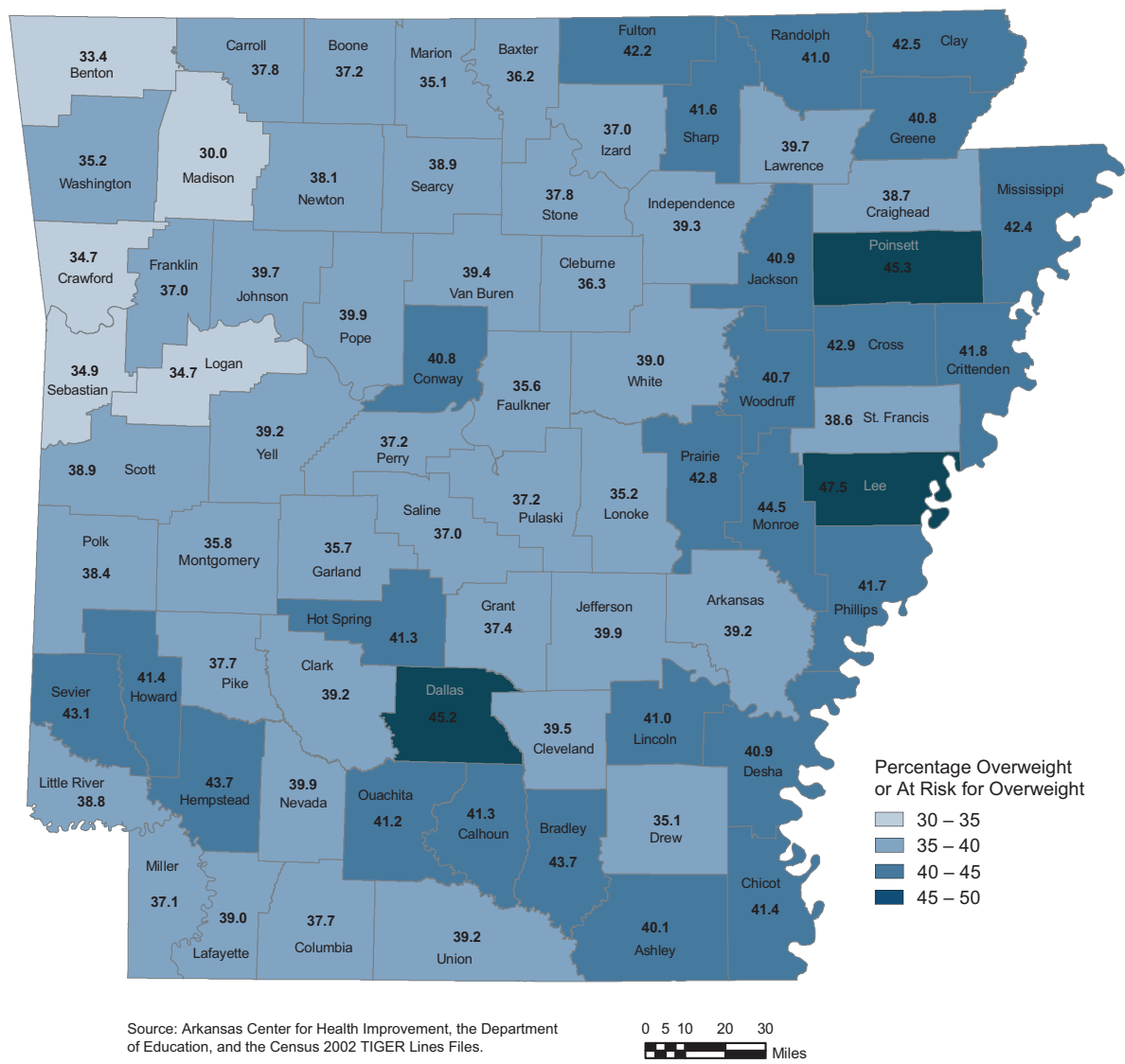
Appendix F lists by county each of the four CDC BMI categories. Categories are combined if the number of students in a particular category is less than five.



Percentage of All Students Overweight or At Risk for Overweight

Lee, Dallas and Poinsett counties had the highest percentage of children overweight or at risk for overweight, with rates exceeding 45 percent. A majority of the counties in the northeast corner of the state and along the Delta had 40–45 percent of their students classified as overweight or at risk for overweight.

FIGURE 13. PERCENTAGE OF ALL STUDENTS OVERWEIGHT OR AT RISK FOR OVERWEIGHT

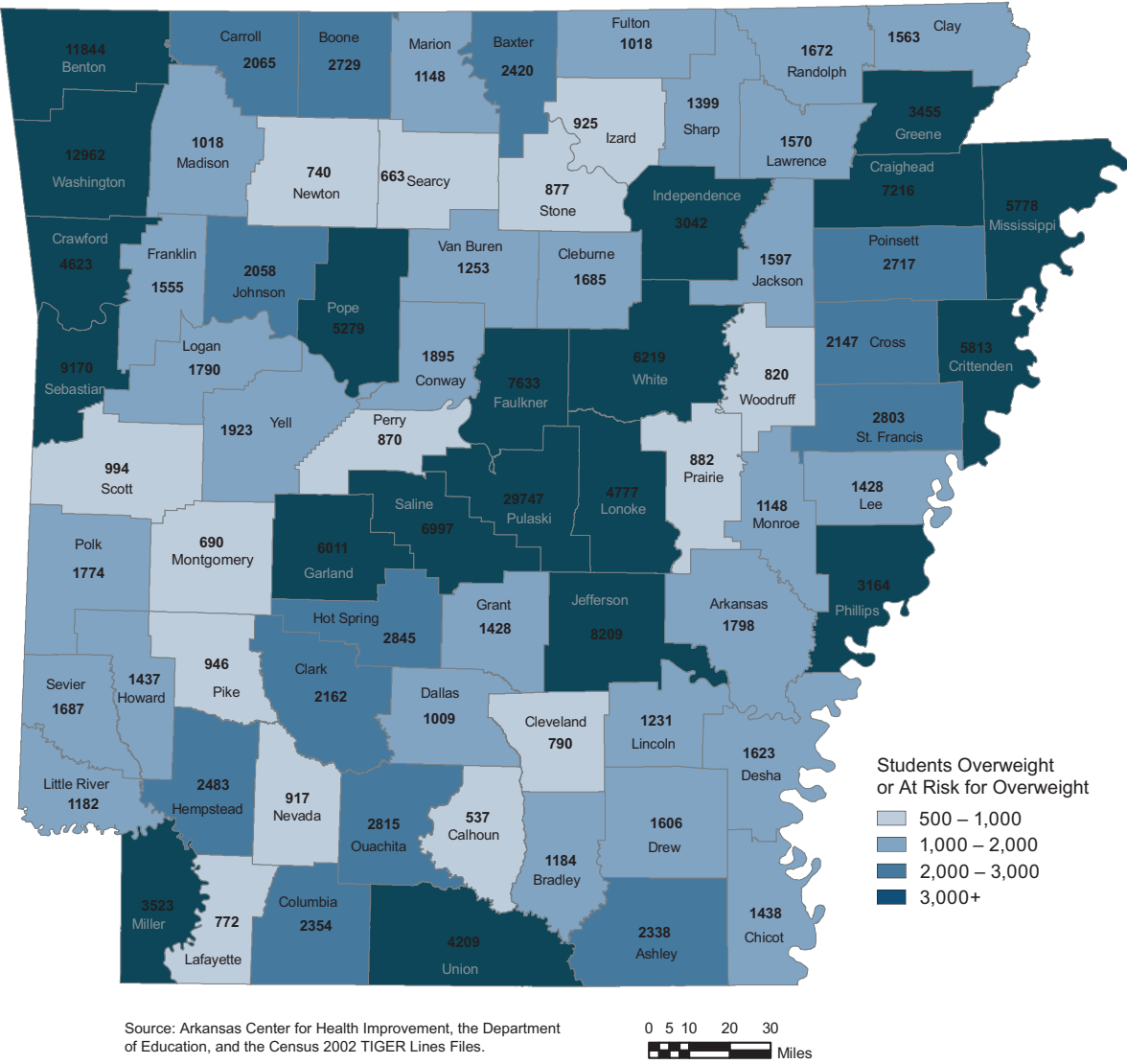




Estimated Number of All Students Overweight or At Risk for Overweight

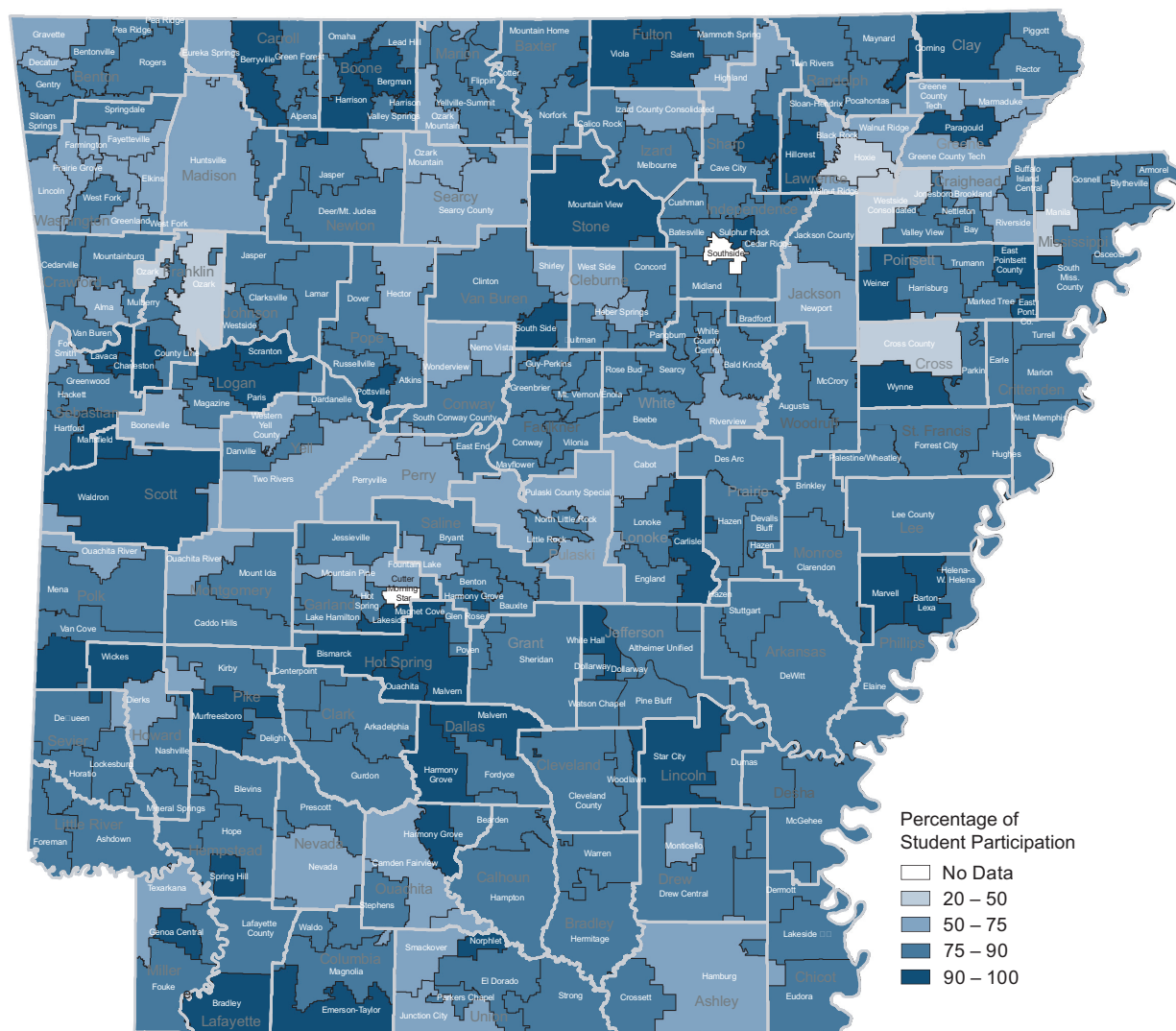

This important letter is about the health of Example Student. Please read all of it.

Many children in Arkansas have health problems caused by their weight. Recently, your child's height and weight were measured at school. Height, weight, age, and gender are used to figure body mass index percentile (BMI). A BMI is a screening test that only tells if a person is overweight, at risk for overweight, a healthy weight, or underweight.

If a child is overweight, it is usually because the child has too much body fat. Children who have too much body fat have higher risks of health problems than those who have a healthy weight. Overweight or at risk children are more likely to become overweight or obese adults. Obesity may lead to diabetes, high blood pressure, heart disease, and many other problems. Children who are underweight may also have health problems.

Why was a BMI measurement done by the school?

State law requires your child's school to measure BMI every year and send a report to you. Arkansas schools also screen children to look for problems with hearing and eyesight. Measuring your child's BMI is another way to help improve his health. Actions taken now may lower the risk of developing serious illnesses as a child gets older. So, it is important to measure BMI every year to see if your child is growing and developing in a healthy way.

Is your child's weight a health problem?

Your child was weighed and measured on March 1, 2005. Example was 5 feet 7 inches tall and weighed 188.2 pounds, which gives him a BMI that suggests he may be **OVERWEIGHT**.

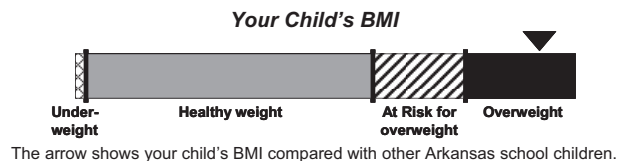
What should you do?

- Offer healthy snacks like fruits, vegetables and foods low in sugar and salt.
- Drink fewer sodas and more water, low-fat milk or low-calorie drinks.
- Limit television and video time to no more than 2 hours a day.
- Take family walks, bicycle, run or exercise with your child.

Esta carta importante se refiere a la salud de Example Student. Por favor léala toda.

Muchos niños en Arkansas tienen problemas de salud debido a su peso. Recientemente, en la escuela de su niña, la estatura y su peso fueron medidos. Las medidas de peso y estatura, así como la edad y el sexo se usaron para calcular el percentil del índice de masa corporal (IMC). El IMC es una prueba inicial que sugiere si una persona tiene sobrepeso, está al riesgo de sobrepeso, tiene peso apropiado o está baja de peso.

Si un niño está pasada de peso, usualmente se debe a que tiene un exceso de grasa corporal. Las niñas que tienen exceso de grasa corporal tienen más riesgo de tener problemas de salud que las niñas con un peso apropiado. Las niñas que están pasadas de peso o en riesgo de estar pasadas de peso son mas propensas a ser adultos obesos o con sobrepeso. La obesidad puede causar enfermedades tales como diabetes, alta presión, problemas del corazón así como otros problemas de salud. Las niñas bajas de peso también pueden tener problemas de salud.

Raramente, la IMC de un niño puede estar alta (sobrepeso o al riesgo de sobrepeso) debido a que el niño sea muy muscular. Al ser muy muscular no aumentan los problemas de la salud en el niño. Solamente puede decir un doctor si la IMC está alta a causa de mucha grasa corporal. Según la información en esta carta, sería bueno que hablara con el doctor de su niña.

¿Por qué se midió el IMC en la escuela?

Las leyes del estado de Arkansas requieren que la escuela de su niña mida el IMC cada año y que se le envíe a usted un reporte sobre los resultados. En las escuelas de Arkansas también se practican pruebas iniciales para buscar problemas con la vista y la audición de los niños. Medir el IMC de su niña es otra manera de ayudarle a cuidar su salud. Acciones que se tomen ahora pueden ayudar a disminuir el riesgo de desarrollar enfermedades serias cuando crezca su niña. Así que, es importante medir el IMC cada año para ver si su niña está creciendo y desarrollando de una manera saludable.

¿Es el peso de su niña un problema de salud?

El pasado 3/1/05, su niña fue medida y pesada en la escuela. EXAMPLE midió 4 pies con 8 pulgadas y pesó 137.4 libras, lo que le da un IMC que sugiere que ella pueda estar **sobrepeso**.

¿Qué debe hacer usted?

- Limitar a dos horas diarias el tiempo viendo televisión o jugando videos.
- Hacer ejercicios con sus niños tales como corriendo, caminando o usando la bicicleta.

Los hábitos saludables empiezan a una edad temprana. Por favor, esté conciente que la alimentación y la actividad física afectarán la salud y vida de su niña.
